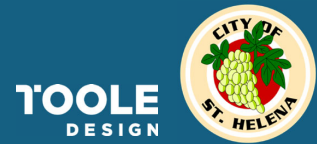
KEY CONSTRAINTS



- **Arterials** hinder bicyclists and pedestrians due to traffic and few crossing opportunities.
- **Dead ends and cul-de-sacs** reduce connectivity.
- **Narrow bridges** cause congestion.
- **Missing and narrow sidewalks** especially on city edges and near schools.
- **Limited transit** may not meet future needs.
- **Many curb ramps aren't ADA-compliant**, and some crossings lack ramps entirely.
- **Lack of streetscape and end-of trip amenities** create discomfort for walkers and bikers.



KEY OPPORTUNITIES



- **Schools** offer opportunities to shift local trips to active transportation.
- **Recent crosswalk and curb ramp improvements** set a citywide precedent.
- **Compact, walkable downtown** with density of destinations.
- **Bridge realignment and road extensions** could ease network barriers.
- **Planned trail facilities**, like the Vine Trail, could anchor an expanded bike/ped network.
- **Green infrastructure** could improve stormwater management and strengthen sense of place.
- **Potential to add sidewalks** to developing outskirts as the city expands.

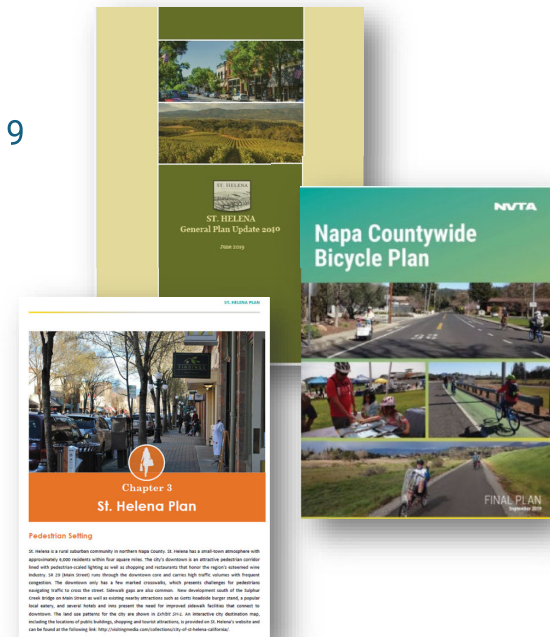
